## Appendix 1

### NAWSA Listing of Government Officials Supporting Women's Suffrage (1902)

The listing of prominent supporters of women's suffrage in these tables is from Susan B. Anthony and Ida Husted Harper, eds., *History of Woman Suffrage*, vol. 4 (Indianapolis: Hollenbeck Press, 1902), 1076–78. It is supplemented with additional information concerning the persons listed, drawn from the *Biographical Directory of the United States Congress, 1774–Present* (Washington, D.C.: U.S. Government Printing Office, 1998) (with respect to dates of service and party affiliation of members of Congress). For government officials other than members of Congress, the most reliable currently available biographical information was used for dates of service and party affiliation.

In a few cases, the *History of Woman Suffrage* incorrectly categorized a U.S. representative or senator as a member of the wrong house of Congress, or incorrectly counted him in both houses rather than only the correct one; those errors have been corrected.

Robert W. Taylor was listed as a U.S. Representative from Ohio when in fact he was the Ohio State Auditor. Robertson Topp was listed as a U.S. Representative from Tennessee when in fact he was a member of the Tennessee House of Representatives. These two are therefore omitted from the list of members of Congress. Joseph E. McDonald was listed as both a U.S. senator and governor of Indiana; in fact he was a senator but an unsuccessful candidate for governor. Alvin Saunders and Ezra Savage were listed as governors of Nevada; in fact both were governors of Nebraska. These errors have been corrected and the individuals properly categorized. Charles J. Folger was listed as a governor of New York; in fact he was an unsuccessful candidate for governor. He has been omitted from the list of governors.

Misspellings are corrected.
